XSEED EDUCATION :TRANSFORMING ELEMENTARY EDUCATION "THE UNAFRAID CHILD WILL COMPETE IN THE 21ST CENTURY"

Ashish Rajpal, an alumnus of the Harvard Graduate School of Education is the brain behind the XSEED Education. The XSEED System is an integrated curriculum, teacher training, and assessment program for K-8 School and out of school education. XSEED replaces a knowledge- transmission or "teaching as telling" approach with an inquiry-based, constructivist approach that use hands-on activities, followed by reflection and feedback.

A recent analysis has proved that XSEED students have stronger communication and language skills, developing original point of view, confidence and independent writing skills. The XSEED curriculum includes higher order thinking questions, independent reading time, and Open discussion in the classroom.

The XSEED School Learning Program replaces "rote" and "teacher talk" led classroom instruction with a five- step child –centered learning process. Visible benefits of the program are curiosity, confidence, the ability to reflect, and higher- order thinking skills in the children.
